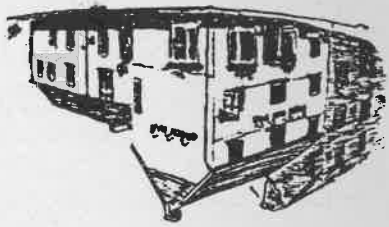


structure to seat about 300? A Ministers house was built in 1835 and he had built the first Girls School in Coleshill, this followed the British and National School Society.

27. Approaching the cross roads over the steepest hill in Warwickshire can be seen



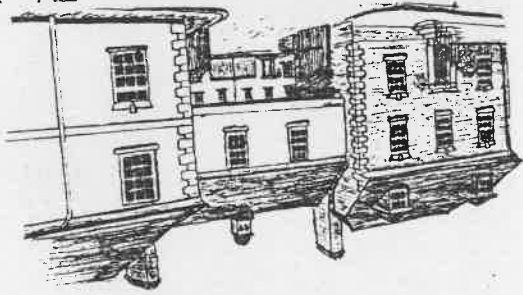
the Green Man.

This is an 18th century inn and at various times during the 19th century was used as a 'carrier' inn. There were regular timetables to Birmingham, Leicester, Coventy, Nuneaton and Atherstone.

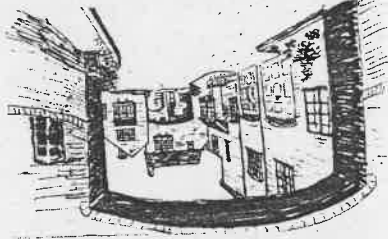
28. Looking up the hill from the Green Man to the Swan Hotel most of the buildings are 18th century. The Angel Inn archway is outlined by a white stringcourse, a small alleyway now leads to the mews development behind.

This building was occupied by a bakery and local residents used to take their Sunday roast to the ovens! Nantile House appears to be a fine 18th century house, but is in fact rendered to suit the fashion of the day. Beneath this is a fine half-timbered dwelling and an original small window can

This attractive development was only built a few years ago around an original late 18th Century house. Which one do you think it is? It is the one on the right. Opposite is another development by the

26. The Bell Inn is the only inn not on the High Street.

It is a low building which is half timbered and covered with stucco. Next-door is the now disused Independent Chapel, which was built, in 1834. It was then described as 'an elegant and commodious Gothic
